











Morning meeting and calendar time

The Ethiopian-Israeli Experience

The arrival of the Ethiopian community is a dramatic chapter in Israel's history but the journey to true arrival - full integration into Israeli society – is an ongoing challenge.

Based on his day-to-day work with peers in the Israeli-Ethiopian community, Yaakov Frohlich will offer a snapshot of where things stand today, convey existing frustrations, share anecdotes, and present differing approaches to social integration. The Fidel Association believes that education, both formal and informal, is the key to meeting this challenge. The word *fidel* is Amharic for "alphabet."

We can't bring back those who died at the hands of the Ethiopian military or from crossing the desert without enough food or water, but we can help ensure that those who survived can fulfill the dream – nurtured for centuries – of life in Eretz Israel.
